Module 1: the verbs

- 1) Auxiliary verbs
 - → to be: questions, affirmative and negative forms
 - → to have: questions, affirmative and negative forms
 - → to be/to have: simple present
 - → to be/to have: contracted forms
 - → to have: the role of got (BE vs AE)

 - → to be thirsty/hungry/afraid/cold/hot/in a hurry

Module 2: the simple present

- 1) Ordinary verbs
 - → questions, affirmative and negative forms
 - → third person singular forms
 - → the role of do as auxiliary and ordinary verb
 - → the role of *have* as auxiliary and ordinary verb
- 2) Simple present and adverbs (initial, mid- and end position)
 - → ever, never, always, sometimes, often, usually, rarely/seldom, hardly ever, every week/month/year, everyday, at weekends, once/twice/thrice a day/week/month/year, on Monday/Sunday
- 3) Stative verbs: adore, like, love, prefer, hate, don't mind, can't stand, abhor, enjoy, be, exist, admire, agree, care, depend, expect, forget, imagine, know, mean, realize, recognize, remember, feel, appreciate, perceive, notice, belong, have (got), own, possess, appear, look like, seem, come from, consist of, contain, cost, deserve, fit, involve, measure, sound, see, taste, smell, suit, weigh, understand, suppose, think, need, want, wish, long, yearn, hope
- 4) Simple present: use
 - → permanent situations
 - → things that happen regularly, repeatedly or all the time

Module 3: the present progressive

- 1) Ordinary verbs
 - → questions, affirmative and negative forms
 - \rightarrow the -ing form
 - → gerund (particular forms): one-syllable verbs, verbs ending in silent –e, verbs ending in -ie

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- 2) Present progressive: use
 - → around now
- 3) Present progressive and adverbs (initial, mid- and end position)
 - → at the moment, now, at present, these days/weeks/months, today
- 4) Simple present vs present progressive

Module 4: nouns, adjectives and pronouns

- 1) The plural
- 2) Countable vs uncountable nouns
 - → packaging: bottle, packet, bar, jar, carton, can, tin, loaf, box, stick, tub, tube, bag, matchbox, roll, pot, cup, glass, slice, piece, serving/helping, steak, pinch, drop/dash, kilo
 - → The use of adjectives (qualities)
 - → place with nouns
 - → invariability
 - → talking about nationality
 - → talking about the weather
- 3) Possessive adjectives and pronouns
- 4) Personal pronouns (subject and object)
- 5) Demonstrative adjectives and pronouns

 - > repeated events
